



Statewide Grade Distribution of **Elementary** Schools Over Time


% of Elementary Schools Statewide Ranked...

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Statewide Grade Distribution of High Schools Over Time





% A and B Grades + % Economically Disadvantaged Students in Major Regions





STATEWIDE DISTRICT ANALYSIS



Dallas ISD increased the most number of schools with A or B grade catching up to Houston ISD (both with nearly 1/3 of schools with an A or B)


% A and B Grades + % Economically Disadvantaged Students in the 10 Largest School Districts in Texas (by enrollment)





Academic Benchmark Performance in Greater Houston











Comparison of Gold Ribbon Schools in Largest HTX Districts Over Time









% Without High School Diploma














3rd grade reading (English-lang only) - % Approaches






